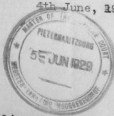

We have received and thank you for your letter of
17th July.

The share of the Deceased under his Father's Will is represented by a leasehold house and War Savings Certificates, and the nearest relative to the Deceased is a daughter of his late brother, and, according to English law, she is entitled to Mr. Ernest Collinson's estate and has expressed the wish to take the leasehold house instead of it being sold. If, under the South African law, the Niece is entitled to the estate of Deceased, we shall be glad to hear whether you have any objection to the house being transferred to the Niece and the value placed at £190 for the purpose of Letters of Administration, this being £5 above the best offer which we have been able to obtain after the property was offered for sale by public auction and withdrawn, and also, after payment to you of any claims made against Deceased's estate, and any expenses, that instead of remitting the balance due to the estate the same may be handed over to the Niece here. Letters of Administration to the estate will have to be re-sealed in the Probate Court here, and for this purpose it will be necessary for you to appoint an Attorney, and we suggest that Mr. George Collinson of Healing, near Grimsby, the Executor under the Will of Mr. Ernest Collinson's Father, should be the person appointed, as under the Will the property is, of course, now vested in him.

We have received a letter from Mrs. T. F. Hollis of 73, Long Market Street, P.M.Burg, making a claim for £1. 12. 6 amount due to her for board, lodging &c., from Mr. Collinson.
